
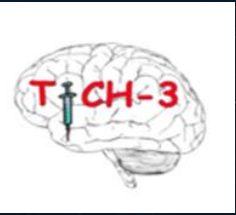

# SWAT Sub-study



**Aim:** To reduce inequalities in enrolling participants from minority communities.

**Population:** All individuals recruited to the TICH-3 trial in the UK.

**Intervention:** Animated participant video

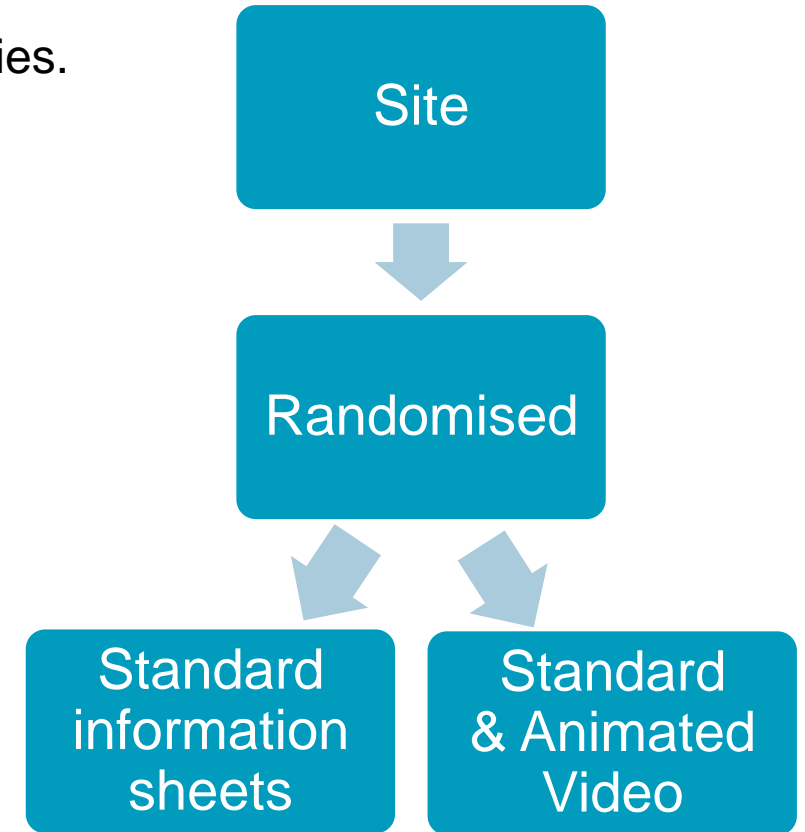
**Control:** Standard information sheets

**Outcome measures:**

1. Proportion providing consent for follow up:
  - i. In the TICH-3 UK study population as a whole
  - ii. By ethnic minority groups versus non-ethnic minority groups
  - iii. Follow up completion rates in the control and intervention groups.

**Design:** Cluster randomisation at site level

Sites will be informed of their randomisation prior to initiation and Sites will be given training on how to use the video if randomised to animated video



**Note:** Animated video will be used **in addition** to the standard consent process and information sheets. Given the age and recent stroke, the intervention **may improve understanding of all participants** not just those in ethnic minority group, we will therefore **include all UK participants** rather than the sub-set from ethnic minority groups in the SWAT.

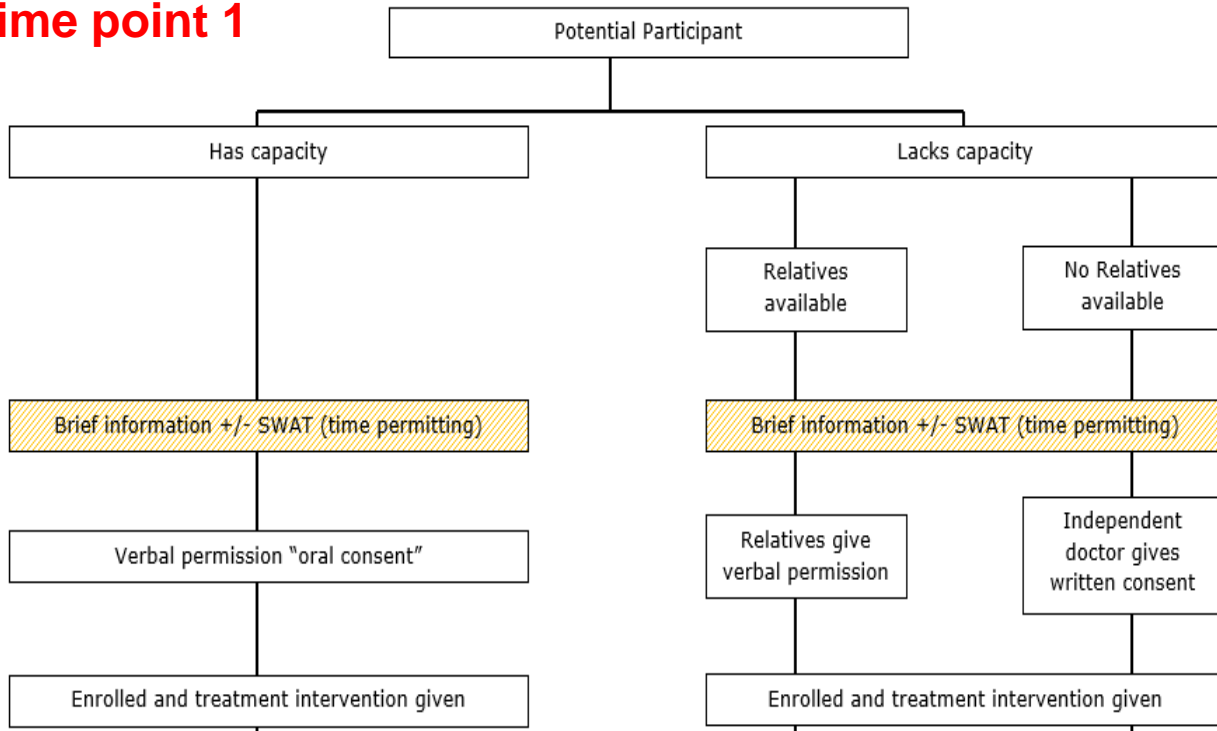

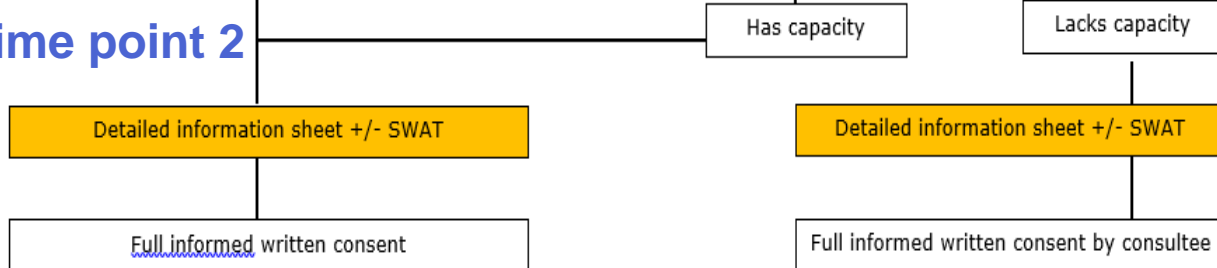
# SWAT Consent Process



## Time point 1



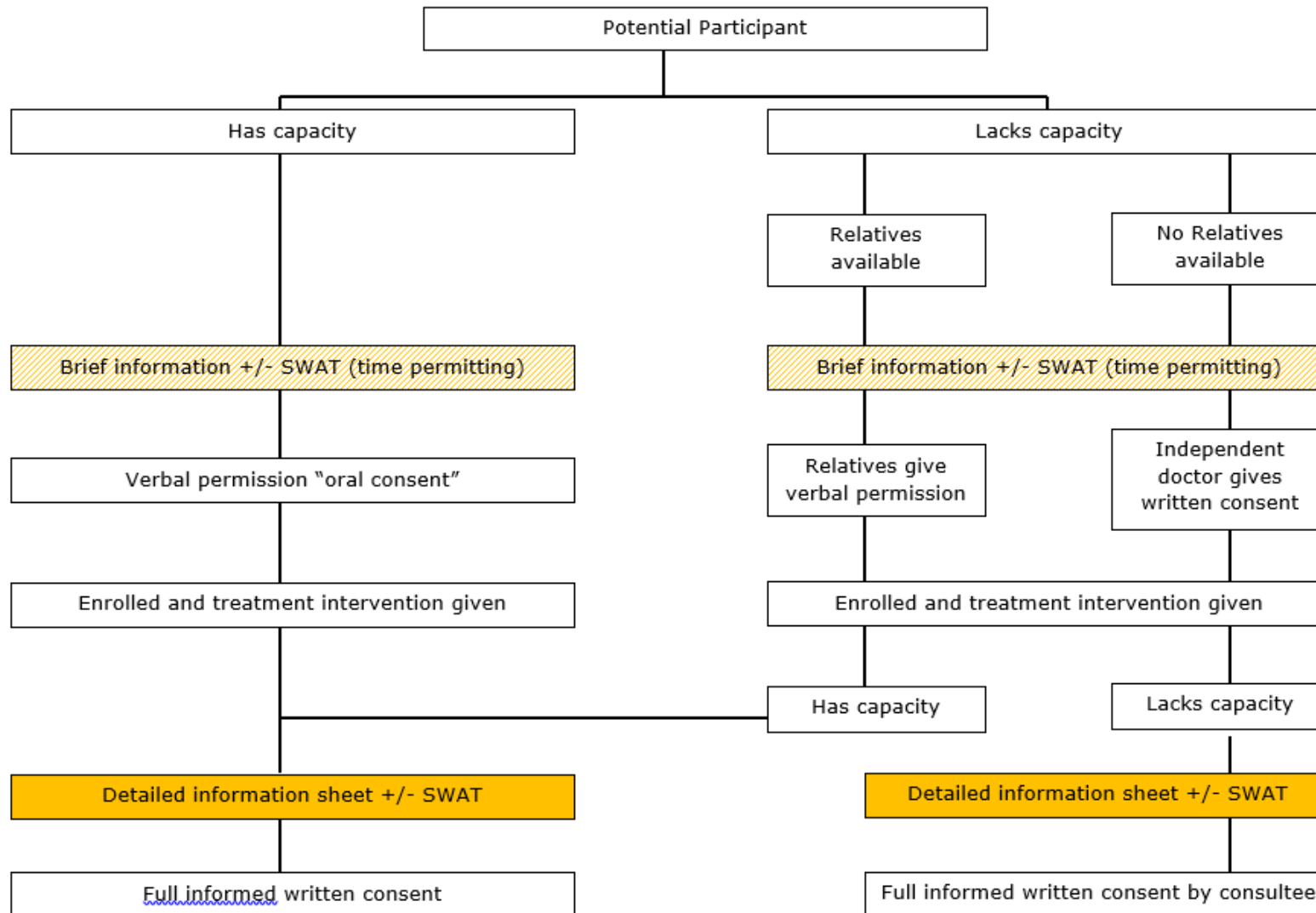

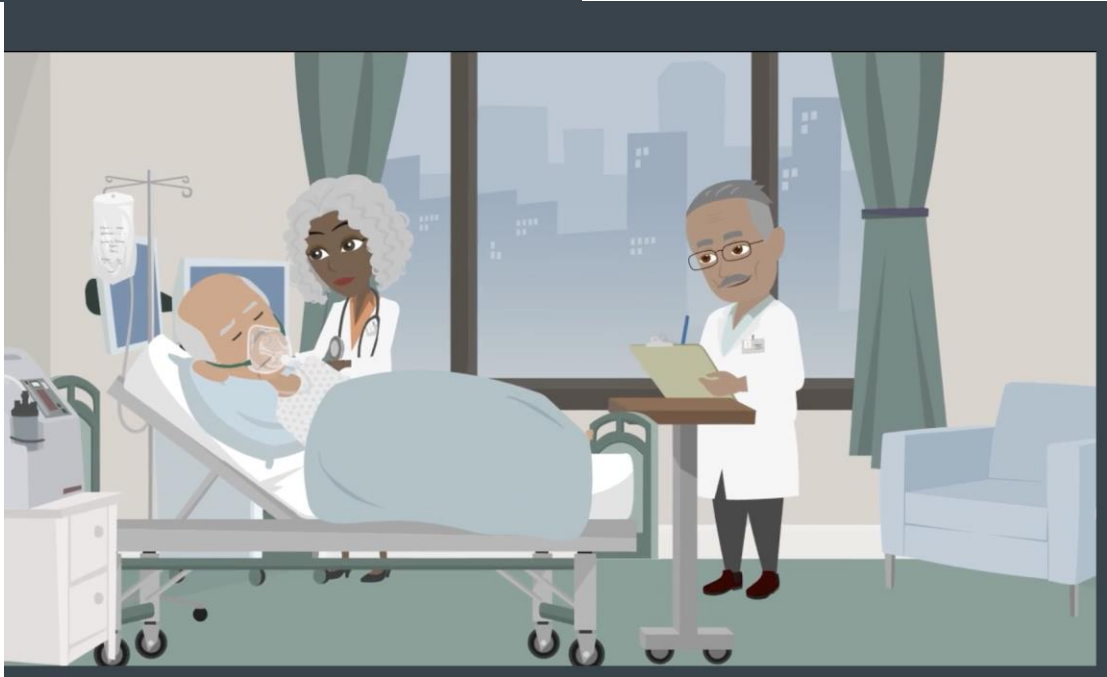
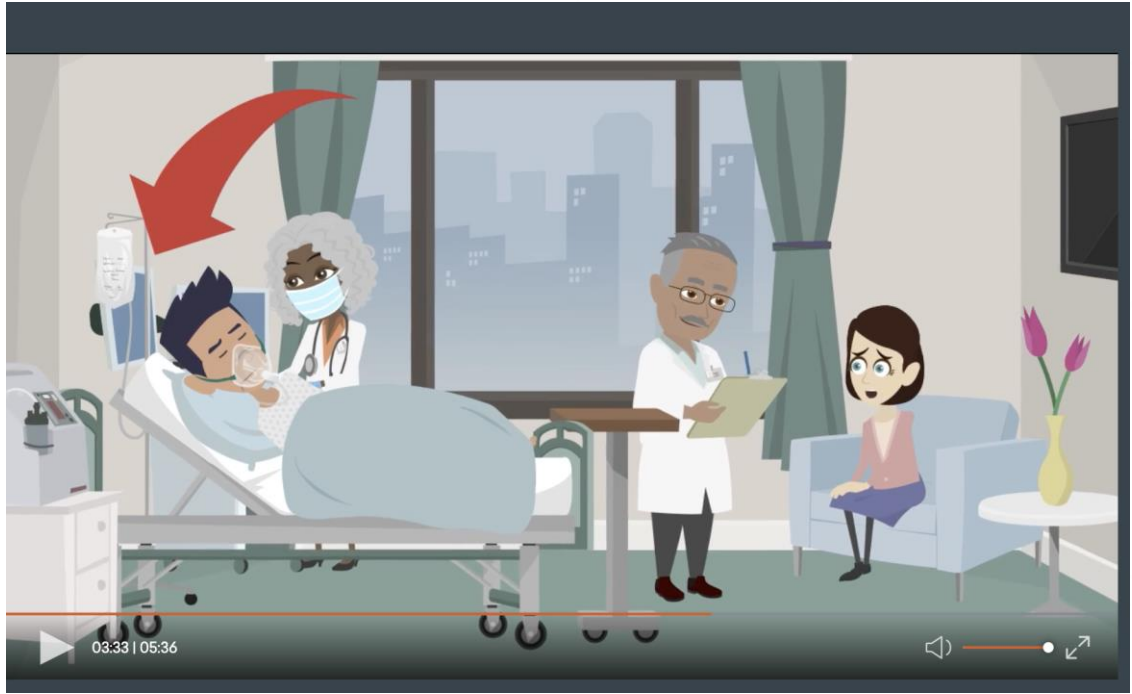
- We anticipate that the SWAT animated video will be mostly used for obtaining follow on written consent, time point 2.
- If time allows, the SWAT animated video can be used when obtaining oral enrolment consent, time point 1.



# SWAT Consent Process Flowchart



- All participants give follow on written consent.
- Sites randomised to the enhanced process will have access to the website with the video in 5 languages.
- enrolment eCRF and day 7 eCRF will capture if the video was used.
- The database will also record when the video is accessed.





# Translated versions of SWAT videos:



- 4 languages available in addition to English - Bengali Polish Punjabi and Urdu
- For foreign languages - video has text in English but the audio has been translated into the above languages
- Please use the video for ALL patients – irrespective of language/ethnicity - the intervention **may improve understanding of all participants** not just those in minority ethnicity groups, we will therefore **include all UK participants** in the SWAT.






# Obtaining site specific access to videos



## TICH-3 log-in only required first time to obtain link

1. Login into to TICH-3 and click on consent video section in contents list  
(Anyone with a TICH-3 investigator account at your site will have access to the link)
2. Get site specific link to consent videos
3. Bookmark this link – it can be used in future without logging in
4. The site specific link can be shared with colleagues at your site – or relatives of patients at your site, no log in is required

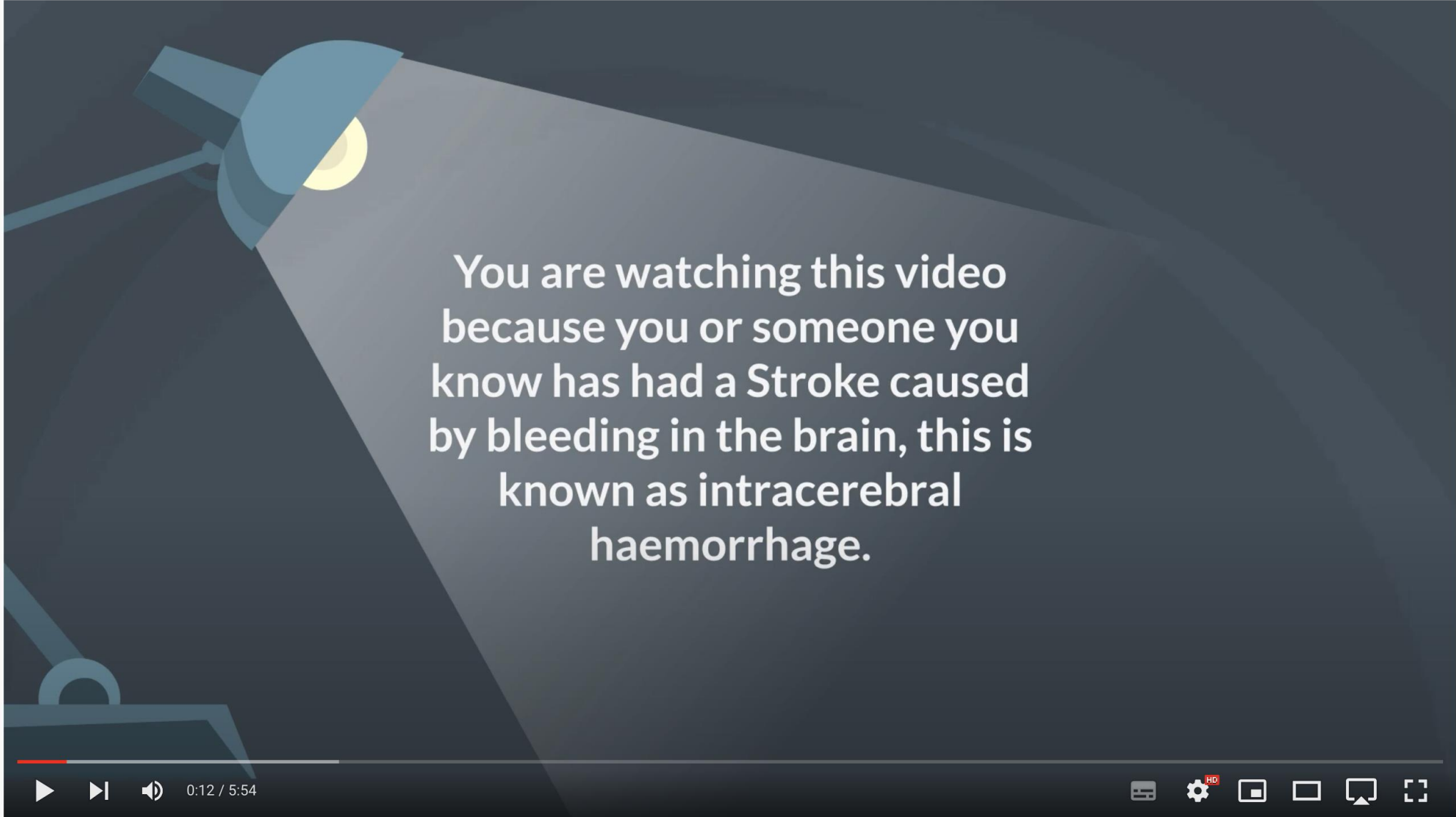

# Summary- Enhanced consent video



- The SWAT video should be used for ALL eligible participants irrespective of language/ethnicity
- Only UK sites randomised into the enhanced consent process (animated video) will have access to the videos
- A site investigator at your site only needs to log in once to obtain the site specific link, this can then be shared with the team and book marked with no further log in requirements to watch the video
- Please DO NOT share the link with any other sites

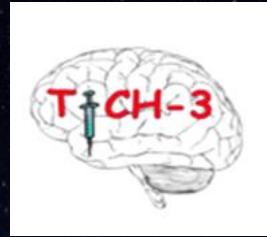
